FIVE MYTHS VS. REAL TRUTH

Myth #1: The Bible has nothing to say against gambling.

- Gambling is contrary to biblical stewardship, 1 Cor 16:1-3; 2 Cor. 8:1-9:7, Jn. 13:29, Eph. 4:28, Mt 22:21; Rom. 13:7
- Gambling is a form of stealing! Ex 20:15, 17
- Gambling promotes violence, Prov 1:10-19, 15:27; 21:25-26
- Gambling appeals to “fate” or “chance” Isa. 65:11 (NIV)
- Violates a biblical work ethic, 2 Thess. 3:10-12; the law of love, Matt 22:34-40; exploits the poor, Amos 5; creates a stumbling block, Rom 14:21

- Gambling is a vice, like alcohol, drugs, prostitution, etc...
- Gambling has no place for a believer, 1 Cor. 6:19

Myth #3: Gambling is “victimless”

- Marital problems, work-related crimes, child neglect, and such increase dramatically in and around gambling places
- Data is beginning to show an increase in suicide and bankruptcy rates related to gambling

Myth #4: Gambling is a viable revenue source

- Gambling money, used as revenue, exploits citizens – those that can least afford it play – “high school dropouts spend four times as much as college graduates”¹
- Gambling only provides 1% of the state education needs
